The Walden Chamber Music Society's second classical concert of the season will be Sun. Jan. 15 at 3 pm in the SteamPlant Theater, with selections by Mozart, Ravel and Johannes Brahms. Beginning at 2 pm, a pre-concert "informance" hosted by Walden pianist Jo Boatright will explain the music to be performed.

The concert features world-renowned violinist Robert Davidovici; violist Barbara Sudweeks from the Dallas Symphony Orchestra; cellist Camilla Bonzo and concert pianist Jo Boatright. They will perform music by Mozart (Duo in G Major for violin and viola, K423), Ravel (Sonata for violin and Piano) and Brahms ("gypsy-flavored" Piano Quartet in G minor, Op. 25).

There are two more concerts remaining in the Society's 2011-12 season. On April 1, a special "April

fool" concert will feature music, art, and theatrical acts. Featured will be works by Erik Satie and Sir Peter Maxwell Davies. On May 20, the final performance of the season will present music by Prokofiev, Brahms, and Carl Maria von Weber. All concerts will be at 3 pm at the SteamPlant; and each will feature prestigious guest artists performing with the Walden regulars.

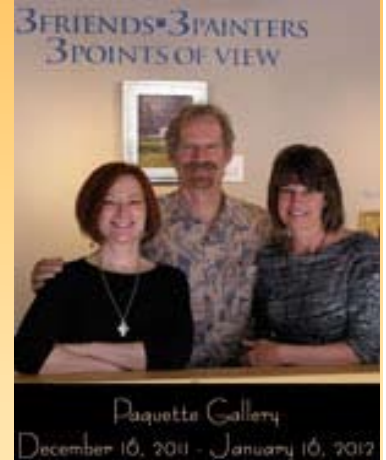

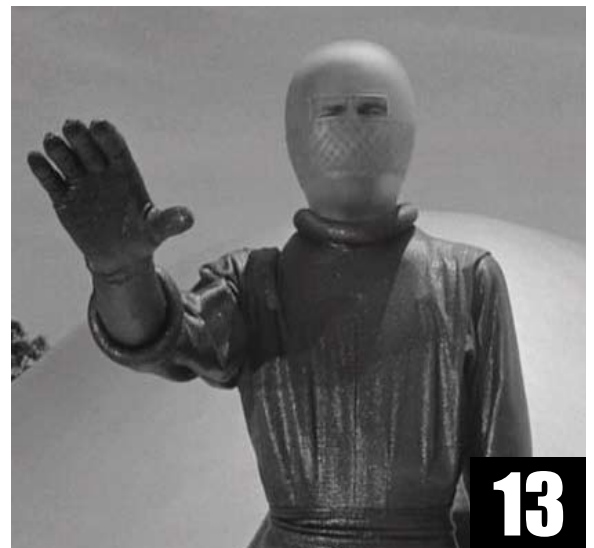

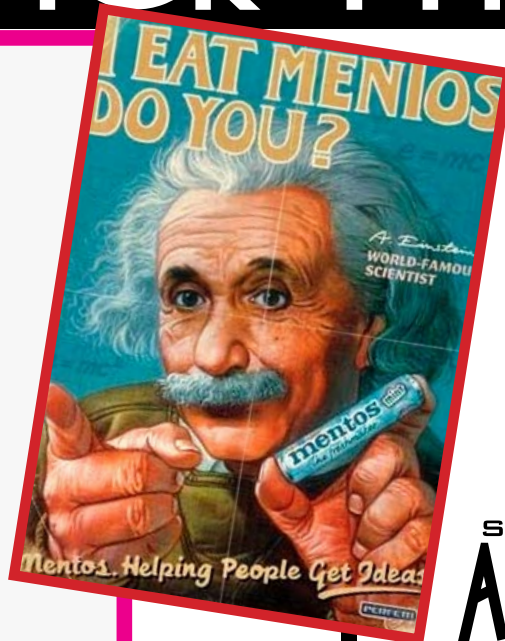
