Riverside Fine Arts Festival is Aug. 14-15



Great music, enticing food and beverages, live entertainment, AND the chance to view and buy works by more than 100 top-notch artists...it all makes the upcoming Riverside Fine Arts Festival one of Salida's most popular events of the year.

More than 100 artists from New York to California, New Mexico to South

Dakota—and even the Netherlands--have been juried into the 2010 Riverside Fine Arts Festival, scheduled for Sat. Aug. 14 and Sun. Aug. 15 at Riverside Park in Salida.

Featured this year will be two exceptional jewelry artists from the Netherlands: **Jan Mattesius** and **Pauline Barendse**.

Jan, the recipient of numerous prestigious awards in Europe, has exhibited throughout Switzerland, England, Australia, Netherlands, Italy and America. Pauline, who has also exhibited widely abroad, has been awarded commissions such as the Laurens Church, Rotterdam, and a "Chain of Honour" for a European Count. The two currently collaborate on translating stories into jewelry and art pieces, combining precious materials and innovative techniques.

Additional Festival attractions again will include the "Riverside Café" serving microbrews and fine wines, food vendors, a 2-day live music stage featuring local and invited musicians, performers from the Salida Circus, a hands-on Family Creative Station for budding artists, and much more.

Jurors for this year's event included goldsmith **Harold O'Connor**, DU Professor Emeritus **Mel Strawn**, artist/instructor **Jude Silva**, and ceramicist/instructor **Clyde Tullis**. Fourteen categories of fine arts will be displayed and sold at the Festival, including painting, jewelry, ceramics, sculpture, fibers, photography, mixed media and more.

The Festival will be open Saturday from 9:30 am-7 pm, and Sunday from 9:30 am-4 pm at Riverside Park, Sackett & F Streets in downtown Salida.

Final Salida Aspen Concerts

Set for Aug. 7 & 14



Your last chance to attend the popular Salida

Aspen Concerts this year will be Aug. 7 and 14--both at 7:30 pm in Salida High School's John Held Auditorium, 10th & D Streets. Pre-concert talks with Aspen Program Director **Deborah Barnekow** and the artists are scheduled for 6:30-7 pm.

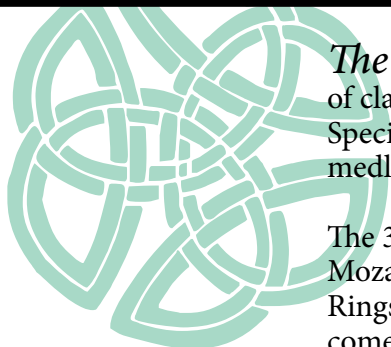
On Sat. Aug. 7, Israeli-born piano virtuoso **Inon Barnatan** will perform Beethoven's "Piano Sonata No. 18 in E-flat Major" ("The Hunt"); Britten/Stevenson's "Peter Grimes Fantasy" (from the opera "Peter Grimes"); Ravel's "La Valse"; and Schubert's "Piano Sonata in A major, D. 959". The 31-year-old pianist is widely esteemed as an expert on Schubert; and performed in Salida last year to an enthusiastic reception.

On Sat. Aug. 14, renowned classical guitarist **Benjamin Pila** will perform Rodrigo's "Tres Piezas Espanolas for Guitar" and other solo selections; and then will be joined by the Tesla Quartet of Boulder, CO. Together they will play Boccherini's "Quintet for Guitar and Strings", and Dvorak's "American Quartet". Pila has performed at New York's Lincoln Center, and Washington DC's John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts. The Tesla Quartet was formed in 2008 at Julliard, and last year won second prize at the Arriaga Chamber Music Competition.

Billed as "World Class Music at Small Town Prices in the Heart of Colorado", the concert series brings musicians from the world famous Aspen Music Festival to Salida. Alpine Orchestra performs

in Salida Aug. 28



The Alpine Orchestra will present a diverse program of classical and contemporary music on Sat. Aug. 28, 7:0 pm at the SteamPlant. Special guest artist will be Buena Vista pianist **Karlie Carter**, featured in a medley of Gershwin tunes and a rendition of "Somewhere In Time".

The 35-member ensemble also will perform works ranging from Beethoven, Mozart, Bizet and other classicists, to music from the movie "Lord of the Rings". Admission to the concert is free, although contributions are welcomed to help defray operating expenses.

The same concert also will be performed Aug. 27 in Leadville, 7:30 pm at Annunciation Catholic Church; and Aug. 29 in Buena Vista, 3 pm at Mountain Heights Baptist Church. Led by conductor **Dr. Farrell Coy** and now entering its 20th season of performing, the Alpine Orchestra is composed of musicians from throughout the Upper Arkansas River Valley.

Over The River EIS comments requested

The long-awaited draft of the Environmental Impact Statement for Christo and Jeanne-Claude's Over The River project was released on



July 16; and the 45-day public comment period is underway. Interested parties can now let the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) know what they think about Over The River.

In addition to analyzing the potential impacts and benefits of the project, the Draft EIS also outlines several alternatives to **Christo and Jeanne-Claude's** original artistic vision. These different alternatives could call for changing a variety of factors, such as the length of the project, the specific locations of the fabric panels, the time of year when the art is exhibited or the duration of the exhibition period. Public comment is one of the ways that the BLM decides which

EIS alternative, if any, will be approved for realization.

There are several ways to review the Draft Environmental Impact Statement. The full document can be downloaded on the BLM's website blm.gov/co/st/en/fo/rgfo/planning/otr.html; and hard copies are also available for review at in Salida at the Arkansas Headwaters Recreation Area office, 307 W. Sackett, or the Salida Regional Library, 405 E St. You can also request a compact disc with the document by calling the BLM at 269.8500.

The BLM is accepting comments via email, online, fax and mail. Written and oral comments also may be made at a at four public meetings:

The meetings will be preceded by an open house from 4-6 pm, followed by a public comment session from 6 pm until all comments have been heard.
