ArtWorks annual Registry Show opens Oct. 22...enter NOW!

Entries currently are being accepted for Salida ArtWorks' popular annual Registry Show, Oct. 22-Nov. 24 at the SteamPlant. This year's expanded show, "Valley Visions & Voices", will be a month-long celebration of the Arts in our valley, presented by ArtWorks, Salida SteamPlant, and the Salida Humanists. A gala Artists Reception will launch the exhibition on Sat. Oct. 23; and the show will be displayed throughout the entire facility.

The Registry Show is open to all painters, sculptors, fiber artists, jewelers, potters, writers, poets, performers and other creatives enrolled with ArtWorks' online Artist's Registry. If you are not yet listed on the Registry, you can do so at no charge on ArtWorks' website. The Registry is a free service that connects area artists, writers, photographers, performers, musicians etc. with patrons, galleries, media and educators throughout the U.S.

Show entry fee is \$10; and you may sign up on the ArtWorks website using PayPal, or print a registration form and mail with your payment. Entries must be delivered to the SteamPlant on Oct. 1 so that a show catalog can be produced. All pieces will be for sale; and a 20% commission will go to the SteamPlant gallery-lighting fund.

Articipate, a nonprofit group working to foster awareness of the Arts,

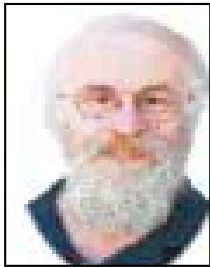

The new CEDE (“Creating Education through Dance Experience”) Studio has opened its doors at the Salida Yoga Center, 112 F. St.



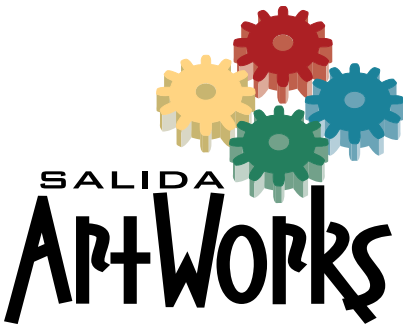

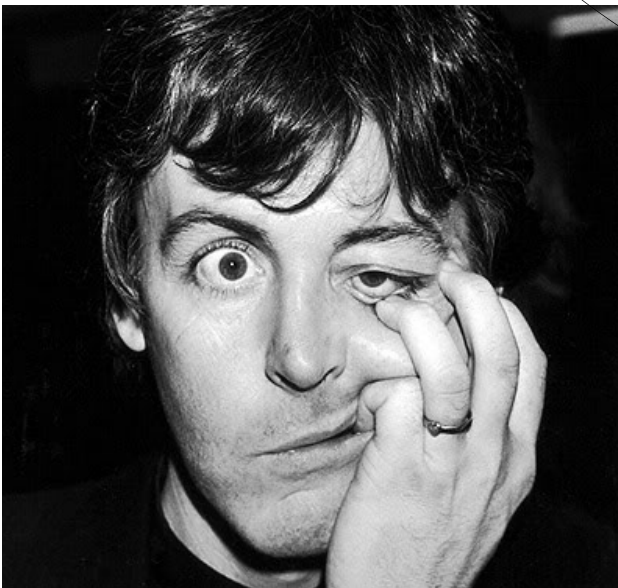
